This year we played our Annual Tournament on two challenging and superbly conditioned courses, Islington Golf Club and The Toronto Golf Club.






## THANK YOU TO OUR HOST CLUBS FOR 2015

I know Ian Gibson is raring to go and I have every confidence Ian will be an excellent Executive Director and take us to new levels in the future.


I trust you will all show Ian the same support and friendship you have shown me.

## 2015 TRIANGULAR MATCHES

London Hunt and Country Club was the host of the 2015 Triangular Cup Matches held June 22-25th. London Hunt is a Robert Trent Jones Golf Course alongside the Thames River in the west end of London, Ontario. It moved to its current 267 acre location in 1960. The club itself dates back to 1885. As a club, activities other than golf include foxhunting, tennis, skeet and trapshooting. What a wonderful place for the matches to be held! London Hunt Club is certainly one of the finest golf club facilities in Canada.



Over the years there have been several London Hunt members who have displayed their golfing talents over the provincial, national and world stage. The most accomplished of those players was Ross "Sandy" Somerville. Sandy was the winner of six Canadian Amateur Championships between 1926 and 1937. His accomplishments also included a U.S. Amateur Championship in 1932. He also won the Canadian Senior Championship 4 times.

Ed Ervasti also a member of London Hunt Club, had an impressive list of accomplishments including the Michigan Amateur Championship, Ontario Senior Amateur 3 times, Canadian Senior Amateur and Canadian Seniors' Golf Association 3 times. He was also President of the Canadian Seniors' Golf Association in 1986 and 1987. Ed passed away just weeks before the Triangular Matches this past year. His son, John competed for the United States team in this year's event.

The 2015 unofficial start was played at Redtail Golf Club in Port Stanley, just south of London. The competitors from all three teams had a perfect day to play at this memorable Donald Steele design. There were plenty of positive comments as there were very few players that had previously played the course. What a nice beginning to the friendly competition!

Monday morning was the opening of the 2015 Triangular Matches with the playing of the Individual Stroke Play Competition. In the end, there were plenty good scores in the low 70's. The

Founders Cup (low gross) went to Ashley Brewer from the UK team and Rick Bauch from the USSGA team tying with a score of 71. Both also tied for the Weller Noble Trophy (low net) with a score of 70.

The T3 trophy is awarded to the group that posts the 4 best scores from each team. This year the T3 Trophy went to the CSGA Team comprised of Chris Kertsos, Mike Jackson, Graham Cooke and Dick Lockwood with a grand total of 294. The USA team (Henry Blue, John Ervasti, Rick Bauch and Tom Slater) finished 4 strokes behind with a total of 298. The SGS team (Ashley Brewer, Hugh Maurice, George Payne and David Hall) scored 307.

Competition for the Triangular Cup started on Tuesday morning playing foursomes in sixes. The day finished quite close with the United States and Canadian teams tied with 12 points each out of the available 33 points. Great Britain was close behind with 9 points.

Wednesday's Singles Matches set up for the all-important final day. Over the final two days, 66 points were up for grabs so the chance for some separation could take place. By Wednesday's close, the CSGA came out on top with 29 (total 41) points, the USSGA with 26 (total 38) and the Brits with 11 (total 20).

As expected, Thursday Singles were going to be a big day for all team members as the Canadian team was leading by only 3 points. One match here or there was going to make the difference.



Although the US team finished the last few matches with some strong performances, it wasn't enough to overcome Canada's 3 point lead going into the day. Both teams finished the day with 27 points. In the end, the Canadian Senior's Golf Association won the Triangular Cup with a grand total of 68 points, the USSGA had 65 points and the SGS had 32 points.

Other trophies were contested over the week as well. The Earl of Derby Cup (players 55-64) was won by the CSGA (40.5 points) over the USSGA (32 points). The Knowles-Somerville Cup (players 65 and up) was won by the USSGA team (33) over CSGA (27.5). The Heminway Cup was taken by London Hunt Club Member Don White with 68 points.

Besides the players, we had executives from the teams at the matches. From Canada we had Don White (Honourary Chairman), Bill Patrick (Secretary, CSGA). From the Society of Seniors there was John Uzielli (President SGS), Dougal Rae (Society Captain), David Stewart (Past Secretary) and Keith MacIntosh (Captain). From the United States there was Sam Carroll (President USSGA), Tim Hultquist (Captain and Vice President), Denny Alexander (Vice Captain) and Bill Sedgwick (Secretary).

The matches, once again, were able to continue the historic tradition of "Friendly Competition" amongst the 3 teams. The next matches are set to be played in the summer of 2017 at the famed Pine Valley Golf Club, just outside Philadelphia.

These events couldn't take place without a lot of planning. A few years ago, Don White made a

case with London Hunt Club to be the 2015 host of the Triangular Matches. Therefore who better should act as the Honourary Chairman of the event than Don? A big "Thank You" goes out to Don for making it happen.

Planning of this event with the club is extensive. All of members of the teams were deeply appreciative of the hospitality and execution of the Triangular Matches orchestrated by Jon Nusink, General Manager.

A great event couldn't take place without someone who actually looks after running the details of the tournament and providing the scoring. Tim McKeiver, Chris Lawson and the whole pro shop and back staff made everyone feel at home.

2014-2015 was a time of construction around the London Hunt clubhouse. Although the club was coming to the end of a \$10.7 million renovation, we were able to hold the team reception and dinner without any problem. A big thank you went out to Food and Beverage Manager, Michael Hearse and his staff for providing a great London Hunt Club experience.

Golf clubs in Southern Ontario had experienced a terrible spring in 2014 with plenty of winter kill. London Hunt Club was no exception. Jayson Griffiths, the club superintendent spent the entire 2014 season bringing back the grass conditions to expected standards. During our Wednesday night banquet, Jayson spent some time addressing the crowd with examples of what he and his team had to do to bring back the course to championship condition. Thanks to Jayson for both the great course conditions and for taking the time to be with us.

Also thanks to Doug Alexander, Past President of London Hunt and immediate Past President of Golf Canada who gave an interesting and very informative history of London Hunt during Wednesday evening's presentations.

Enough can't be said about our Executive Director, Bill Patrick. As most know, Bill is retiring at the end of 2015. As a player, you go to an event like this to



play some golf, have some fellowship, dinners etc. You don't need to think much about how it all happens. As host of the Matches, it was the CSGA's responsibility to set everything up and that was Bill's job. Bill made sure that all details were set before we even got to London. Can you imagine setting up 5 days of breakfast, lunch and dinner for 75 people? Tee times, transportation, hotel reservations, team pictures, receptions and restaurants were all covered. We could always count on Bill. Thanks go to Bill for pulling this one off but also for all of the tireless work he has done for the complete CSGA Membership. I know that he is looking forward to his second retirement. I really hope that he gets to play the amount of golf next year that he deserves. In the past few years, he missed a lot of play because of his dedication to the CSGA.

Bill is a friend to all the players on the three teams. His efforts were acknowledged at the awards ceremony with a standing ovation. Thanks Bill!

More importantly, I know that we had a group of guys that were team players, but also a group that shared great friendships. 


